CURRENT RESEARCH:

My dissertation will establish the first validated cohort of family physicians with 'Care of the Elderly' (COE) certifications within administrative health records at the Institute for Clinical and Evaluative Sciences (ICES). I will investigate COE family physician practice patterns, workforce trends, access to care, and health services outcomes among older primary care patients.

In addition, I research physician practice patterns and quality indicators in nursing homes. For example, I am leading a descriptive analysis to characterize physicians who practice in nursing homes and an investigation of factors that drive non-routine physician visits in this setting. I also conduct medical education research about geriatric-focused disciplines, including an analysis of applicant trends in pursuing geriatric training and core competencies of geriatric-focused physicians.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT:

My primary career goal is to pursue a productive research career as an independent scientist by conducting rigorous epidemiological studies concerning the organization and delivery of health care services to older patients in a variety of settings. My ideal career portfolio will comprise both research and teaching responsibilities at an academic institution and/or health care setting.

I am a first-year PhD student in Health Research Methodology at McMaster University after recently transferring from the MSc program.

Before attending McMaster, I graduated from the University of Waterloo with a BSc in Honours Health Studies with an Aging Studies Option and Medical Physiology Minor.
